Mass Incarceration Group - from meeting on February 25, 2021

The governor's budget includes several items we have been advocating – increased money for Treatment and Diversion (TAD), expanded earned release, and transfer of 17 years olds back to juvenile court. Both TAD and the earned release program save the state four or more dollars for each dollar spent. Encouraging the finance committee to keep these items in the final budget is important. Watch for information on contacting them. The governor did stress investing in people rather than prisons but did not explicitly create the Justice Reinvestment Fund that WISDOM and MICAH had requested.
